


67 Miles Away from Ward 31











Our son Archie, now 9 years old was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukaemia (AML) mid-August 2018. He spent 7 months in Leeds General Infirmary (LGI) on the Children's Oncology & Haematology Ward 31 being treated by the lovely doctors and nurses. As Archie was receiving intense chemotherapy he only had a handful of days at home in between his four sessions.

Archie lives in a village East of Hull with mum, dad, his twin sister Connie and his little sister Alice. This was a total distance of 67 miles away from LGI so this was creating major problems for us so being the first family to be offered a room in the newly renovated Candlelighters cottage was amazing. We jumped at the chance to stay there and couldn't believe how nice it was when we were shown around. When you are living in a hospital month after month you can soon go crazy, so having use of a bright, modern, cosy, spacious house complete with all mod cons was very much appreciated. The cottage really helped us with 'Archie's Journey' as a whole. It relieved the pressure of the logistical nightmare and vastly improved our mental state.

The cottage enabled Archie's sisters to stay over at the weekend and during the school holidays so that we could be a family and have a little snippet of normality without paying ridiculous hotel fees. Grandma and Grandad alternated their stay during the week which was great as whichever parent spent the night with Archie then had the option to go to the cottage and freshen up, do some washing or catch up on some much needed sleep.

When on chemotherapy your taste buds can change daily. It didn't take long for Archie to lose interest in the hospital food provided and on the ward there was only a microwave and a fridge. When Archie was well enough we were able to do some proper cooking in the oven with some of his favourite meals and all sit around a table - the nice little things like this that you take for granted at home. It was also a very much welcomed change of scenery for us all and Archie looked forward to his time there. We played board games, completed jigsaws, plugged his Playstation in or just sprawled out on the sofas and watched TV together and it felt like home for the few hours we were there. We spent all of Christmas and New Year in Leeds General Infirmary so again having a 'nice warm home' to go to made Christmas bearable. For us as a family the Cottage was a lifeline and we are truly grateful to have been able to use this amazing facility and are very thankful for the support Candlelighters gave us throughout our hospital stay.



Whether sharing stories, coping strategies or simply having some time out, Family Network Groups are a great opportunity to connect with others who 'Get it'.

Please note, as there are now a number of groups across Yorkshire, we ask that you attend the group that's most convenient / appropriate to you.

Nobody really understands what it is like to be affected by childhood cancer until it happens to you. Talking to others who have been there and "Get it" is amazing. You do not have to explain how you are feeling or make apologies or explain why you cancelled your plans. There is a general sense of understanding, it is fine to talk about how you feel equally its fine if you don't want to talk. You find that you are not alone and that how you are feeling is normal. The not sleeping, stiff and aching neck, shoulders and back are common features of others that have been affected. The constant worry about absolutely everything is normal. The fact that there are not enough hours in the day to do everything. Juggling work, school, hospital appointments, family life, whilst totally neglecting yourself. The Network is time for me to talk, unload, relax and recoup. It is time for me to be me.

CAN YOU TELL US A LITTLE ABOUT YOUR STORY?

My son Connor was on treatment for Ewings Sarcoma. Connor lost his battle in 2014 at 15 years old. I chose to have a change in career, after being a chef for 20 years and went back to university, studying Psychology and Counselling.

WHAT IS YOUR CONNECTION WITH CANDLELIGHTERS?

We first heard about Candlelighters when Connor was diagnosed. We went on two holidays, as well as visiting a Royal Air Force station at Linton-on-Ouse. In the second year of my new course, I was able to take on a placement and approached Candlelighters to see if I could do it with them. I finished that back in April but still volunteer on a Friday and I'm also a Family Network Volunteer.

HOW DID YOU KEEP POSITIVE THROUGHOUT YOUR IOURNEY?

My son Connor kept us all going, he had a really positive outlook on life and he carried that the whole way through his journey. Don't get me wrong there was a mixture of good and bad days but the good outweighed the bad. I had a good network of family and friends but no matter how much they said they understood, unless you've been in that situation, nobody really gets it. I think the Family Network is so important, for the answers to those questions that can only be answered by someone who has been there, bought the t-shirt and read the book.

WHY DID YOU WANT TO BECOME A FAMILY NETWORK VOLUNTEER?

Families facing childhood cancer are unfortunately in the same boat and although no two journeys are the same, we all share similar worries, concerns, low and high points. People now have an opportunity to speak to their peers and hopefully we will be able to make their journey that bit easier, like Candlelighters does for us all.



CAN VALUE TELL LIS A LITTLE ABOUT VALID STADY

Six years ago, my son was diagnosed with Rhabdomyosarcoma at the age of 15.

WHAT IS YOUR CONNECTION WITH CANDLELIGHTERS'

Candlelighters were there from day one, providing help and support. Often it's the small things that are hardly noticed like daily sweets and treats, Sunday lunch and a friendly smile. As time went on, I realised Candlelighters do so much more, such as funding hospital wards, staff and research as well as supporting families through the difficult times.

HOW DID YOU KEEP POSITIVE THROUGHOUT

I maintained a positive outlook throughout my journey because of my son's personality, humour and never stop fighting attitude. Knowing I had the support and assistance from family and friends but also the excellent staff at Leeds Children's Hospital and St James Bexley and while all the time, Candlelighters were there to support not only my son, but the whole family and people affected.

CAN YOU TELL US A LITTLE ABOUT YOUR STORY?

Our journey took us to America and London for specialist treatment as well as in Leeds and at times, it was a lonely journey as we did not have anybody who 'understood' to talk to. This is why I volunteered to be a Family Network Volunteer, so I can be there to offer an understanding ear to all families who are or have gone through a similar tough journey.

The Candlelighters Family Network is where families and past patients give peer support to others who are facing their own cancer journey

Here at Candlelighters we love pink but did you know our charity colours are pink and green and we are striving to be as GREEN as possible!

2019 has seen the beginning of a new team - our very own Green Team. The purpose of the team is to implement changes to make Candlelighters more environmentally friendly and to work towards reducing any type of pollution we create - and that is exactly what we have been busy doing!

The team was formulated after changes had already been made with the environment in mind. This year was the first year we stopped releasing balloons at Day of Memories and made the amazing change to bubble art. Balloon releases have held a special place at Day of Memories and we didn't want to lose this lovely sentiment so we wanted to think of something that could match this moment. At first we were unsure about this change but we received amazing feedback from our families!

For the first time earlier this year this newsletter was sent out in recycled envelopes, not plastic packaging. We are also looking into having a digital option for our newsletter in the future.

We have moved on from the use of plastic water bottles at The Square. Now after a relaxing wellbeing session at The Square you will be offered a glass of cold water from our kilner jar. This small change has made a big impact on our plastic use and cut costs!

In addition, we have made a number of small but easy changes like defaulting to double sided printing, reminding people to turn off lights, promoting car sharing and not boiling more water than needed for brews.

With all these changes we also have cost reduction in mind. By making little changes we can save money and therefore the money raised by YOU can go further in supporting our families.



Signs & symptoms

Cancer symptoms can be very similar to those of other illnesses and they vary between children. The following symptoms are not usually cancer, but it's always worth a visit to your doctor if your child has any of these...

Continued, unexplained weight loss

eadaches, often with early morning vomiting

ncreased swelling or persistent pain in the bones, joints, back or legs

Lump or mass, especially in the abdomen, neck, chest, pelvis or armpits

Development of excessive bruising, bleeding or rash

Constant, frequent, or persistent infections

A whitish colour behind the pupil

Nausea that persists or vomiting without nausea

Constant tiredness or noticeable paleness

Eye or vision changes that occur suddenly or persist

Recurring or persistent fevers of unknown origin

Go with your gut instinct, if your child does not seem right, persist and seek advice from the professionals. As a parent you are the expert on your child. You know when something is wrong.
