The Candlelighters Cottage

Since opening in November, all of our rooms have been occupied for the majority of time, highlighting just how essential this new facility is for our oncology families.

Since opening we have supported 10 families enabling them to stay within a 5 minute walk of the Children's Hospital, in order for them to be close to their child whilst receiving treatment.

This support is vital for families who live far away from the hospital and would have to travel great distances each day to be together. The opening of the cottage just before Christmas enabled families who unfortunately had to be on the ward over Christmas to spend this holiday period together.

The Candlelighters Cottage is specifically for oncology families supported by Candlelighters. All bookings go through Eckersley House, part of The Sick Children's Trust charity which enables us to manage demand appropriately.




A Year in Corporate Fundraising at Candlelighters

Rainbow Baby Group is a new group that we have set up for our families as part of the Family Network. This group is for parents who have had a baby after losing a child to cancer. The group is run by Family Network Volunteers who themselves have been affected by childhood cancer.



We are a very friendly group. This group is for people whom have had rainbow babies as well as those whom are expecting. Parenting after the loss of a child brings a new wave of love and laughter, but parallel to that are a rollercoaster of emotions. It can be hard to discuss these emotions in other baby groups, so this one provides you with a safe environment to talk all you want; whether it be about your child that died; other siblings, your rainbow baby or just a general natter about nothing in particular!

We offer a talking therapy service to our families who feel they may need some support 1 to 1 in a private, relaxed environment. A cancer diagnosis may bring up issues and the feeling that you need to talk to someone; and we are here to help.

Our talking therapists are based in Leeds, Ilkley and York but can cover the whole of Yorkshire depending on your circumstances. We want our talking therapy service to be as accessible as possible as we understand not everyone can easily get to our family support centre in Leeds.

How did you find out about Candlelighters?

I first became aware of Candlelighters in 2009 when our son James was diagnosed with Rhabdomyosarcoma this led to long spells in the wards, sat watching him and all the medical teams while all the time not fully understanding what was going on

and feeling like we had nobody to speak to. The only highlight of the day was when Elaine came round with the sweetie trolley and we would pretend James wanted some when really it was us.

The hardest part of all was the night when you had to take it in turns to leave your child and partner to go home as there was only a small uncomfortable chair bed, those nights felt very long and worrying just waiting to get back to the hospital.

Despite the fantastic efforts of Leeds Children's Hospital,

Proton Therapy Team in America and the neuro team in London,

James lost his 4 year battle but his positive, comical and can do attitude has stuck with us and many others who knew him.

During this time we were made aware of the help and support that Candlelighters offered to families in our position and began to visit The Square, either just for a coffee and a chat or one of the many therapies on offer including my favourite, a relaxing massage.

The renovation of The Candlelighters Cottage provides a place to stay with family and is still very close to the hospital, which must be such a relief to parents, knowing they can keep the family together and be available at short notice. We were fortunate to live in Leeds but some families will live far away and not having to be so far apart, travelling long daily commutes will make this difficult period a little bit easier.

Over the last few years between myself, my wife and daughter Emma, we have done a number of fundraising events to show our support for Candlelighters, this includes, cycle rides, runs and a black tie ball. My wife is also a family network volunteer and since then, I have been looking for a way I can offer my skills to help Candlelighters and other families.

I jumped at the chance to apply for the Gardener role and really enjoy working with the Candlelighters team, coming up with ideas and designs to create a clean, safe, relaxing and colourful garden area for families to enjoy at both The Cottage and Pavilion, over at the Leeds Children's Hospital.

With Spring approaching, I am getting busy planting up the gardens and baskets to bring a splash of colour and hopefully a smile and a little bit of joy to the families.

Do you want to help shape our future?

Here at Candlelighters we are continually looking at how we can improve the services we offer for those who use it. As part of a year long project, with the help of Dr Bob Phillips, Vicky will be exploring how we can improve and develop our family support services for those affected by childhood cancer throughout Yorkshire.

We already know the range of support services we offer to our families is unique and that since The Square opened its doors in 2015 the number of families using our facilities is ever-growing. But we also know that there are a proportion of families who do not use our services and that there are various factors which may stop families accessing them; they may have to travel from far away, they may not realise they can use the services, they may not need the type of support we currently offer...the list goes on.

So we are going to be looking at what is currently offered across Yorkshire, both by us & other charities, find out what the families and medical teams want and explore if we can address some of the gaps. It is so important that we understand how to support all families at every stage of their journey; whether you are on treatment, post treatment or bereaved.

Our ultimate aim is to expand our reach across Yorkshire, supporting more families & providing a wider range of support services in a place close to home. However to do this we need YOU! We want to hear from everyone no matter how long you have been on your journey, it is so important that we understand how to support all families at every stage of their journey; whether you are on treatment, post treatment or bereaved.

One year at Candlelighters



Thanks to your incredible support here's just some of the things we have done throughout one year at Candlelighters.

We funded 34,580 hours of additional hospital support roles across the Leeds Children's Hospital Oncology and Radiotherapy wards, including play leaders, support workers, a dinner lady, social workers, a radiographer and a speech and language therapist too.



We held 30 Family Network Support Groups of which approximately 120 family members attended



Our family network groups aim to bring our families together so that they can form lasting bonds and friendships with those who might have been through a similar situation.

- ★ The Candlelighters bus was on the road over 20 times visiting families across Yorkshire, including trips to Skipton, Huddersfield and over to Malton.
- ★ Our Support Centre 'The Square' offered approximately 1220 wellbeing appointments for families (including massage, aromatherapy and reflexology). We also provided 257 Talking Therapies to families and their children.
- ★ We continued to fund research including our Research Fellowship Programme, enabling Leeds to be a leading centre in developing the skills and expertise of the next generation of cancer doctors, ensuring that children in the future will be cared for by leading experts in Yorkshire.
