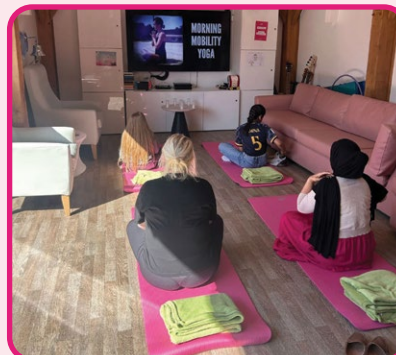
Pink It Up Pie Splat

Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

September is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, a time to recognise the impact cancer has on children and their families across the world.

We raise awareness of childhood cancer all year, but in September we shine an even brighter light. It's our chance to spotlight the realities children face and share the ways we're helping families through their toughest times.

To understand why this month matters so much, meet Harper - a brave five-year-old whose family's world was turned upside down by a diagnosis they never expected.

Harper's story:

Abi and Anthony live in Bradford with their two children, Harper and Oscar. Aged just three years old, Harper was diagnosed with a rare tumour. Abi shares their story...

"We spent five months not knowing what was wrong with Harper, endless tests and procedures with no answers. The moment we got the diagnosis was the moment our lives changed forever.

Harper was diagnosed with a really rare and aggressive tumour, and we found out she would need chemotherapy every week for the next six months, which was just the start of our journey.

Things move so quickly and you get thrown into a world that you're not prepared for, there's no guidebook for how to navigate it as every family's journey is so different.

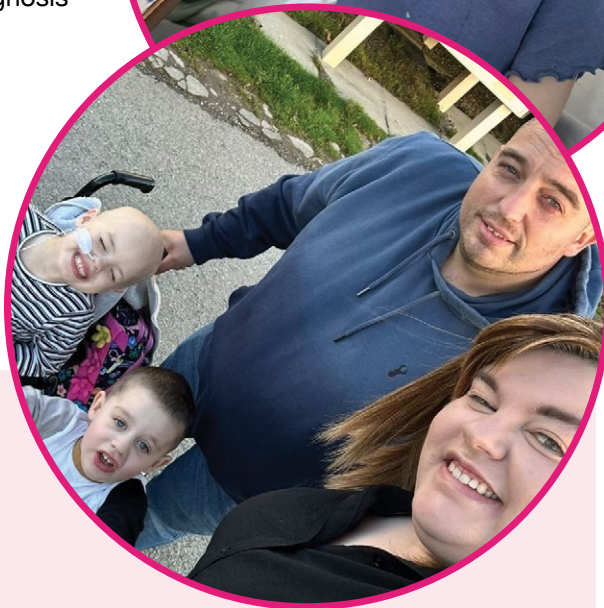
It took a big toll on each of us. Your whole life changes, every day routines go completely out of the window. Harper is so strong, most days stronger than us, she's incredible. But as parents, it was really hard to watch our little girl go from confident and bubbly to so scared and isolated.

Candlelighters has been there every single step of the way. From the moment we were told Harper's diagnosis, they were waiting with open arms.

Having the Family Support Workers on the ward has really helped us through. Things like a cup of tea and a chat might seem small to someone who hasn't been through it, but it's so important when you are in this isolated and lonely bubble - they make you feel secure and safe when everything is so uncertain. They're great with Harper too, she loves arts and crafts, so they bring stickers and play dough and sit with her for a while which keeps her happy and entertained.

I've also had access to Candlelighters talking therapy, and I can't express how much it helped.

As Harper's mum, I struggled to cope with her treatment and also felt guilty about being away from Oscar, who was only two. We had amazing support, but when the door closed, it was a lot to process.



Those early days were dark, and having a safe space to talk made all the difference. It helped me accept what was happening and reminded me that we were doing our best, and that was enough.

As a family, we've also loved attending Candlelighters events like the Family Fun Day at Sherburn Aero Club in 2024. When your child is on treatment, chances to feel like a normal family are rare. There was no talk of cancer, just fun. Harper even flew in a plane for the first time and loved it! Being able to enjoy that without financial stress was special. I spent the first year of Harper's treatment off work and going down to a one income household brought its own pressures.

We're nearly two years in, and our journey has been very up and down. We don't know how long it will last. Living with that uncertainty is tricky, it's a rollercoaster no one can prepare you for and you can only truly understand when you're in it.



But it's showed us how strong we are as a family, everything we can get through and it's brought us closer. Most days Harper is stronger than we are, she gets us through it and is doing amazingly – we just need to keep strong for her.

I don't think we'll ever be able to thank Candlelighters enough for everything they have been able to do for us, and all the families they touch. We have received so much support, which wouldn't be possible if not for people fundraising and giving all they can. You don't realise the impact of what that little bit of help can do until you're on the receiving end of it.

Champ's Pantry wins award!

A big highlight last year was the launch of Champ's Pantry, a free food service for families with a child in hospital for cancer treatment.

When you're spending long days on the ward, sorting out meals can be just one more thing to worry about. Between emotional stress and rising costs, finding something quick, healthy and affordable isn't always easy. That's where Champ's Pantry comes in, stocked with dried goods, fruit, snacks and ready meals that parents can grab and go, free of charge.

The idea started as a small pilot but has now become a key part of our support services. And we're proud to say it's also won national recognition!

Our trustees picked up the Challenge to Change Award at the Charity Governance Awards, celebrating the difference Champ's Pantry is making for families facing some of their toughest days.

Spotlight on our new role: Family Wellbeing Practitioner

We're thrilled to share that Ryan, previously one of our dedicated Family Support Workers, has stepped into a new role as our Family Wellbeing Practitioner.

This new position reflects the additional support Ryan can now provide following the completion of his counselling training. It marks an important step forward in how we support families, allowing us to offer more in-depth emotional and psychological care.

Ryan will continue to be based at both the hospital and The Square, working closely with families. In his new role, he'll also be offering individual counselling for family members aged 16 and over, helping to ensure they receive the compassionate, expert support they need during challenging times.



"Hi I'm Ryan! Some of you may know me from my family support role at the hospital. Now that I am a qualified therapist, I will be offering 1-to-1 counselling sessions at The Square, online or over the phone for ages 16 and over. My therapy style is a blend of person-centred counselling and cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) and I am experienced in the world of children's oncology. I am also leading on Dad's groups, so if you are a Dad wanting to connect with like minded people, then be sure to sign up for those down the line."

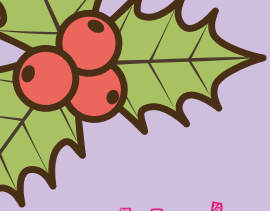

The campaign runs for just seven days this Christmas between **2nd – 9th December**, so save the date and watch this space for updates on how you can take part and help us reach our biggest target yet!



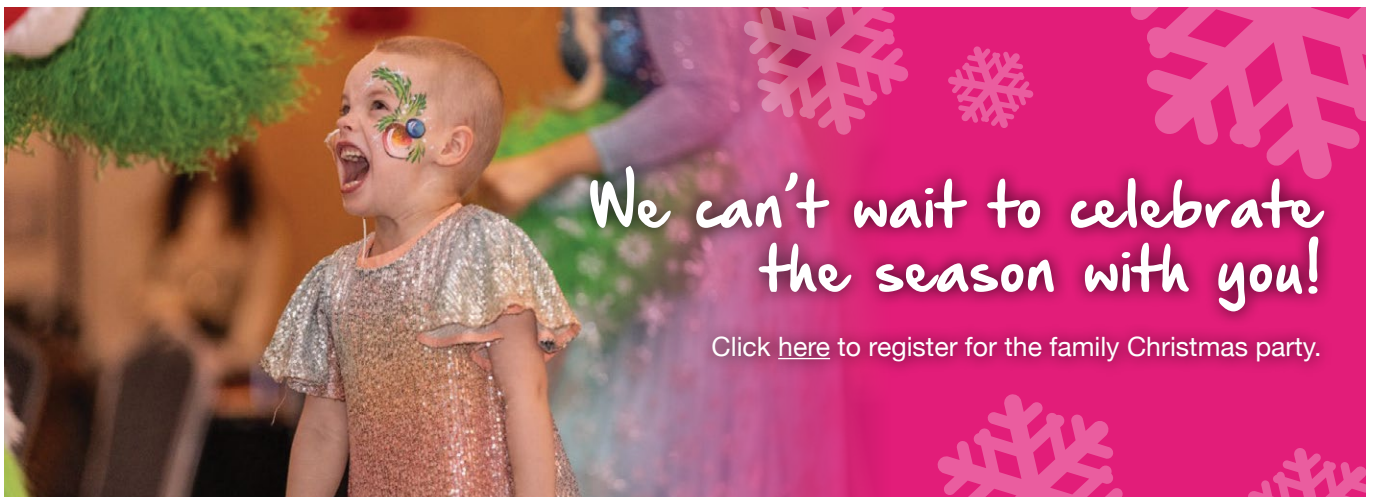
Save the Date: Candlelighters Family Christmas Party 2025

Meet Team Clarkey Boy

On 4th January 2025, just three days before Clarke's first birthday, his world changed forever. Clarke was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukaemia (AML), something no family ever imagines hearing.

On his birthday, instead of celebrating, his parents were holding his hand in intensive care after he suffered a seizure. Clarke spent almost 6 gruelling months in hospital, filled with chemotherapy, blood and platelet transfusions, painful side effects, infections, and isolation rooms.

His mum Kegan explains: "He's faced everything with a strength that's hard to put into words. We are so incredibly proud of him."

"Through all of this, Candlelighters have been by our side. They've provided us with accommodation close to the hospital, so we could stay near Clarke. They've supported our wellbeing with therapy and emotional support when things felt overwhelming. They've brought joy to the ward, with activities that help children still be children, even in the darkest times."

Candlelighters Teams are fundraising groups made up of family, friends and local communities all with a common goal, to raise funds, awareness and support. We have been blown away by everything Team Clarkey Boy have achieved so far...

The family have a close connection to Wakefield Trinity Rugby League Club, where Clarke's grandad Daryl, is Head Coach. In June, the club held a fundraiser for Candlelighters during their Super League contest with Leigh Leopards.

In a very special family moment, ahead of kick off, the two teams were led out by Daryl and Kegan, with a smiling Clarke wearing a superhero cape, and his sister Reeva.



The players wore special shirts, with the 'Team Clarkey Boy' logo on, for the match, which were auctioned off to raise money for Candlelighters, while bucket collections took place.

And during Pink It Up Week, Team Clarkey Boy organised a competition on their local high

street, where shops turned their window displays pink to raise money for Candlelighters.

So far, Team Clarkey Boy has raised an incredible £39,544. We can't wait to hear what they do next...

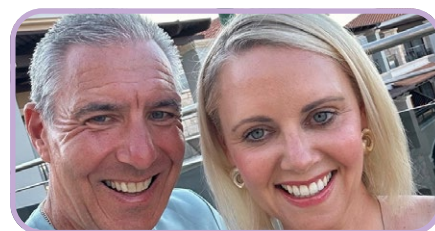
